Social value delivery sits at the heart of our frameworks, creating opportunities that go beyond project completion to deliver lasting benefit for communities.

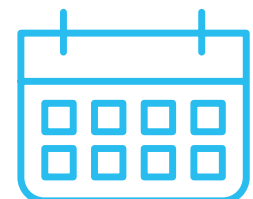

Light a Candle for the Veterans' Federation

As part of our continued commitment to supporting the veteran community, SCAPE, Arc Partnership and 15 of SCAPE's framework delivery partners came together to support the Veterans' Foundation Memorial Wall - a permanent online tribute honouring the lives of loved ones who once served in the Armed Forces.

Through the collaborative 'Light a Candle' initiative, £1,615 was donated to the military charity, which raises funds through the Veterans' Lottery and public donations to provide life-changing grants to British Armed Forces charities.

Every candle lit is a tribute to those who served and are no longer with us, while also helping to support veterans in need today. The heartfelt tributes shared as part of the initiative came from friends, family members and loved ones across our partner organisations, making the campaign even more meaningful.

This contribution will go towards helping serving personnel, veterans and their families facing challenges including mental health, physical injuries, homelessness, poverty, and addiction, while also funding employment and family welfare support services - making a real difference where it's needed most.

Since 2016, the charity has given more than £30m in grants to hundreds of military charities across the UK. Organisations supported by the Veterans' Foundation provide a wide range of services addressing the issues faced by serving personnel and veterans, including homelessness, medical support and employment assistance.

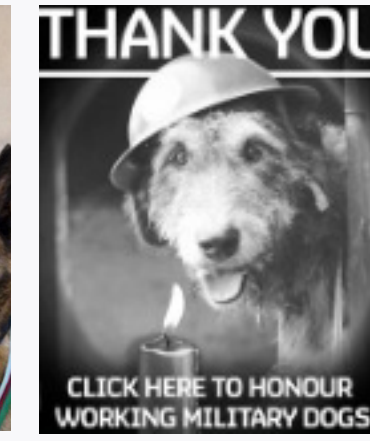

Care Leavers Life Skills Programme

In March, SCAPE was proud to support the first cohort of 26 young adults through the Care Leavers Life Skills Programme, a hands-on initiative led by Norman Galloway Homes that is designed to build confidence, independence, and essential everyday skills.

Norman Galloway Homes is a not-for-profit organisation providing supported accommodation services and person-centred jobs for children in care and care leavers aged 16-21. Delivered in partnership with our dedicated delivery partners, the programme provided practical, real-world learning experiences ranging from understanding safety through PPE, to painting, decorating, and developing core DIY skills. Each session focused on empowering participants with the knowledge and confidence to manage and maintain their own living spaces.

Through a unique, real-life training environment, young people had the opportunity to practice everyday tasks in a safe and supportive setting, gaining not just practical ability, but also problem-solving skills, teamwork, and a sense of achievement.

A collaborative initiative for the Community Legacy Programme, the Life Skills Programme received a £10,000 donation through SCAPE Reinvest, alongside additional funding from delivery partners, donated materials, and volunteering time to support the delivery of sessions.

The programme aims to support 144 individuals throughout 2026, and the Community Legacy Programme looks forward to continuing its support for young people as the initiative develops.

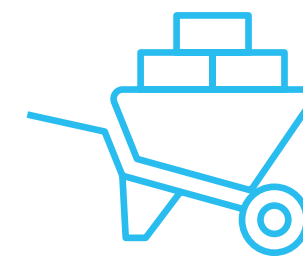

Get into Construction

In March, SCAPE provided funding towards the 'Get into Construction' event organised by Action 4 Construction and hosted by West Notts College, where 150 Year 10 pupils from across the region gained hands-on insight into careers within the construction industry.

The event highlighted the wide range of pathways available within the sector, from traditional trades to technical and professional roles, while giving pupils the opportunity to speak directly with industry experts about future career options.

As part of the event:

- GF Tomlinson delivered a door-hanging exercise, giving pupils the opportunity to gain practical experience while also receiving careers advice.
- Lindum Group introduced a surveying activity, demonstrating how a theodolite is used within site management.
- In the carpentry workshop, Clegg Construction, supported by current students, taught pupils how to build their own bird boxes to take home.
- Via East Midlands Ltd spoke to pupils about the diverse careers available within highways, including surveying, construction and crossing patrol services.

MORGAN SINDALL CONSTRUCTION

By embedding social, economic, and environmental benefits into education through procurement, curriculum support and community engagement, we help to develop skills, improve equity, and contribute to a more resilient and inclusive society.

Lindum hosted “A Day as a Lindum Employee” as part of the World of Work Day at Boston Grammar School. The workshop provided students with a hands-on introduction to construction project delivery through a realistic, team-based exercise. By taking on professional roles and developing a mixed-use scheme to present, students gained valuable insight into industry practices and challenges.

The session also supported the development of key employability skills, including teamwork, communication, problem-solving, and leadership, while increasing awareness of careers within the sector. Following the event, the Deputy SENDCo shared that students “had an amazing time and thoroughly enjoyed themselves”.

Lindum also hosted a road safety workshop at Nottingham Girls’ Academy. The session provided an interactive and practical introduction to road safety, focusing on the risks associated with large vehicles. Through a combination of classroom learning and a live lorry demonstration, pupils gained a clearer understanding of driver visibility and blind spots, helping to promote safer behaviours through an engaging and memorable learning experience.

Balfour Beatty funded Farm Urban’s Future Food Heroes programme across three Sefton primary schools, providing pupils with hands-on learning through classroom aquaponics systems and sustainability-focused activities. The programme helped pupils develop knowledge of healthy food systems, sustainability and future green careers, while also building confidence, teamwork and environmental awareness within communities most in need of support.

In March, Morgan Sindall delivered careers in construction sessions at Chuter Ede Primary School, introducing pupils to industry roles, key skills and the links between education and future careers. A topping out ceremony was also held at the Fernwood site, marking a key milestone and bringing together stakeholders and pupils, who toured the site and signed a commemorative board that has since been installed within the building.

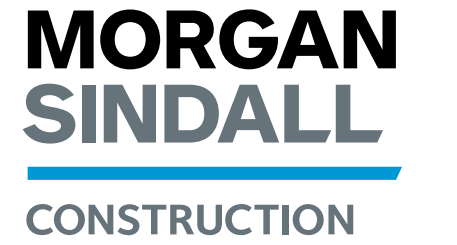
RNLI Mablethorpe Lifeboat Station

The Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI) Mablethorpe Lifeboat Station has relied on volunteers since 1883 to deliver lifesaving responses along the Lincolnshire coast, often in challenging conditions. To improve safety and visibility during lifeboat launches, the Head Launcher role was provided with a new protective jacket, funded by a £165 donation from the Balfour Beatty Fulbeck Pumping Station project team. This contribution formed part of the project's wider commitment to supporting local volunteer emergency services.

Meeting Community Needs continued



Intro2Work Programme

Morgan Sindall has supported the Intro2Work programme in Peterborough, delivered at the city's youth hub. The initiative helps participants build confidence and explore employment opportunities in construction. Activities included a construction-themed escape room to develop practical and problem-solving skills, alongside mock interviews and mentoring sessions.

Just Transition Initiative

The Morgan Sindall East Region team also launched a Just Transition initiative in Peterborough to support local women into construction careers. Participants completed a two-week programme covering sustainable building practices, retrofitting and modern construction methods, alongside practical experience in renewable technologies and trade skills.

As a result of the programme, four participants will progress into 12-week paid internships with Morgan Sindall Construction and its supply chain partners, while an additional participant will join the Great Haddon Primary School project as a labourer.

Middlecross Assisted Living Project

The Middlecross Assisted Living project team supported two Year 13 T-Level students from Leeds College of Building through industry placements. One student completed a site management placement and will return following exams to continue gaining experience, while another secured a university place to study architecture and is being supported to return to their placement.

In addition, an unemployed finance graduate living near the Middlecross Assisted Living project approached Morgan Sindall seeking quantity surveying work experience and volunteered one day per week from summer 2025. Following completion of the placement in January 2026, the individual secured a paid internship on the preconstruction contract for a new SCAPE scheme in Leeds.

VAWG Awareness Initiative

As part of the Chesterfield Custody Suite project, Willmott Dixon supported Derbyshire Police in raising awareness of Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) within the construction industry.

In partnership with students from the University of Nottingham, a 10-week internship programme was delivered to research and develop campaign messaging aimed at construction workers, with a focus on promoting positive behaviours and encouraging proactive bystander intervention.

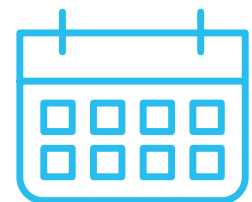

Volunteering

Volunteering delivers significant social value by supporting community needs, improving local facilities and strengthening relationships between businesses, charities and residents. It also helps develop skills, confidence and wellbeing among volunteers, while creating measurable positive outcomes and leaving a lasting community legacy.

On 25 March, 10 employees from Willmott Dixon and its supply chain partners volunteered a combined total of 50 hours at Pathways of Chesterfield, a charity supporting people experiencing homelessness and those at risk of homelessness across Chesterfield, North East Derbyshire and Bolsover.

The charity provides housing advice and support, mental health and nursing services, tenancy support, activities and wellbeing provision, alongside partnerships with local dentists and opticians to support service users.

During the volunteer day, the team carried out painting and decorating works to improve staff and service-user areas, helping to create a more welcoming environment and boost staff morale. The project also enabled the charity to save valuable resources while strengthening collaboration across the project supply chain.
