Core activities included: girl guides, career talks, school visits, arts & craft for families

Balfour Beatty welcomed T Level placement students to site. They joined a meeting with SCAPE to discuss their career options and the diverse roles and opportunities in construction.

The students from Bradford College gained knowledge and grew in confidence, and we hope to see them applying for apprenticeship roles soon.

Mace ran a fun arts and crafts activity morning with Home Start, a local community network supporting families with young children through challenging times.

They also supported the progression of surveyors on their route to chartership through RICS.

Girl Guides were supported by their unit leader who is a Kier Quantity Surveyor, answering their questions about her own career, and encouraging them to look at opportunities within the world of STEM, through apprenticeships or graduate schemes, inspiring the next generation and endorsing their motto "girls can do anything".




Core activities included: litter picking, path maintenance, protecting & promoting nature, repairing walls, gates & fences, tree planting, restoring benches, improving facilities, garden clearance

Conamar, Lungfish Architects, Mace, Morgan Sindall, Stepnell and Willmott Dixon have carried out practical conservation work for our country's woodlands, peaks, moors and wildlife reserves, as well as canals and rivers, improving the areas for visitors and wildlife alike.

Environmental efforts saw volunteers plant and care for 1,000+ trees to protect land, support habitats and enable eco education. They also cleared litter, weeded paths, rebuilt bridges, repaired walls, reinstated a dew pond and transformed a hospital garden into a peaceful space.

Core activities included: food bank donation, animal shelter, charity shop, big sleep out, renovation works

Foodbanks across the UK were supported this quarter by GF Tomlinson, Kier, Mace, RG Carter, Morgan Sindall, SCAPE, Stepnell and Willmott Dixon — many through Tesco's Winter Food Collection with FareShare and Trussell Trust. Activities included trolley dashes, food collections, sorting, deliveries and encouraging in-store donations for communities facing hardship.

Over 200 local people took part in St Alban's Big Sleep Out, which RG Carter helped organise with Herts Young Homeless.

The night raised an incredible £42,000 for the five charities, Emmaus Hertfordshire, Centre 33m, The Living Room, Open Door St Albans and Herts Young Homeless.

Teckles animal sanctuary receives regular support at its charity shop from Mace, while SCAPE's marketing team donned PPE to help refurbish the new home of our charity of the year, Footprints. The new space will be a game-changer, supporting children with mobility and communication difficulties across the East Midlands.



Core activities included: Christmas wrapping, Christmas gift donations, Santa Claus

Morgan Sindall supported Lancashire Cash for Kids to help ensure every child woke up to a gift on Christmas morning — sorting, packing and collecting thousands of donated presents. Their one day of volunteering reached around 3,400 children, with some younger ones receiving multiple gifts.

Lindum donated a selection of gifts for all ages and, with the help of SCAPE client, Lincolnshire County Council, wrapped the gifts, ready for distribution to the local community through the Horncastle Community Larder. The outcome of this volunteering experience meant 25 local people in the community received a gift.

And finally, Chris Davies from Conamar ensured foster children and nursery school children got a visit from Father Christmas at their parties.
